# What are the SATs?

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The SATs are a series of end of Key Stage Two standardised tests for Year 6 pupils.

Pupils are tested in:

- **Reading** (1 test)
- **Maths** (3 tests- 1 arithmetic and 2 reasoning)
- **Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling** (2 tests- 1 Grammar and Punctuation and 1 Spelling)

Children are not tested in Writing or Science, but Teacher Assessment is submitted for these.

# When are the SATs?

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The 2023-24 SATs will take place from **Monday 13th May - Thursday 16th May 2024.**

**Monday** → Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling

**Tuesday** → Reading

**Wednesday** → Arithmetic and Reasoning 1

**Thursday** → Reasoning 2

# How do the tests work?

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- Children will sit the tests in their classroom or in a smaller, quiet space.
- All tests take place in the morning. The rest of the day consists of normal classroom learning.
- Tests are sent away for external marking.
- Children will have lots of practice of 'test-like conditions' prior to SATs week.

# What are the possible outcomes?

<b>GPS /70</b>	36/70	58/70

# How are the children prepared at school?

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- The tests consist of questions from across the Key Stage Two curriculum- so the children have had lots of preparation already!
- Children will be taught and have the opportunity to practise sitting formal tests this year. This includes time management and test technique.
- Booster and intervention groups will give all children the chance to work in small groups to target any areas that need improvement.

# What extra support is available?

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- Pupils with specific needs may require additional arrangements so they can take the KS2 SATs.
- Access arrangements might be used to support pupils who have difficulty reading or writing; difficulty concentrating; processing difficulties or a visual/hearing impairment.
- Examples of additional arrangements might include: a reader, a scribe, rest breaks, prompts or additional time.
- School will monitor and apply for additional access arrangements in the Spring term. This will involve discussion with the pupil and the parents/carers.

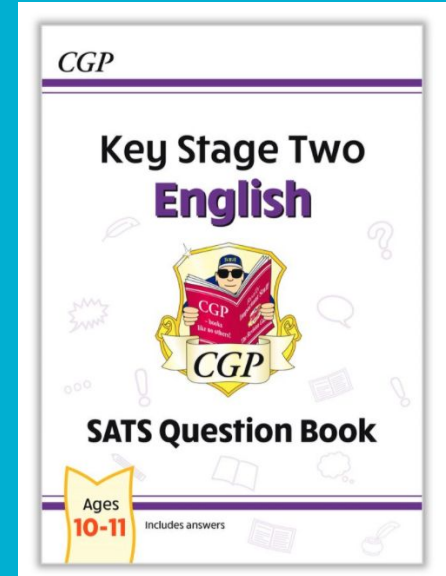
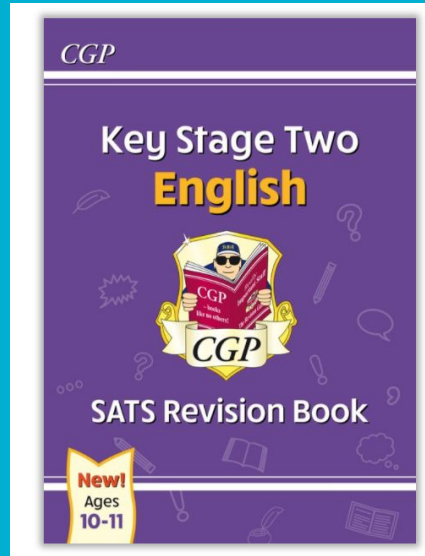
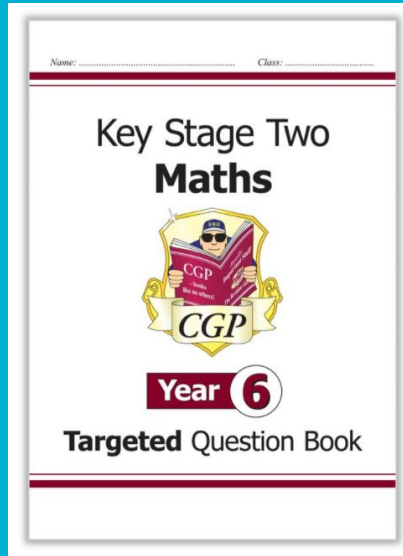
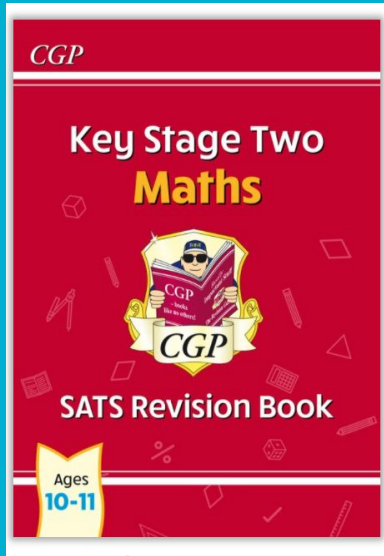
# How can I support my child at home?

# What happens with the results?

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- School receive the results in July.
- Children, parents and carers are given the results.
